

Engaging Children and Youth

Provide opportunities for the children and youth to learn and experience mission and to respond to God's call. Make it exciting and fun!

Here are a few ideas:

- Plan a service activity one a month, or once a quarter.
- Participate in youth mission trips or join with other churches on mission trips. There are many areas around the state including Flint Forge or a Compassionate Ministry Center.
- Participate in Crisis Care Kits and School Pal Paks.
- Encourage children and youth to give financially to the WEF, Alabaster, Easter and Thanks Offerings.
- Explain the concepts compassion, missions, service and prayer.
- Involve children and youth in your Faith Promise plans.
- When having a missionary in your church, plan a separate time for them to speak with your children and youth.
- Present a monthly missions lesson for children and youth.
- Include them in learning how to pray and making prayer reminders for the entire church.
- Provide global awareness of people's needs. Ask for their ideas on service projects and then act on it!
- Volunteer at Community Services Centers, Day Centers, and Mission Centers.
- Go to school play grounds and pick up trash especially before school starts. Offer awards!
- Do leaf raking, pick up sticks in the yards after winter, shrub trimming, window washing for the elderly, changing out smoke detector batteries, handing out hot chocolate to the homeless.
- Shopping cart retrieval for those strip malls or smaller stores that might not have designated employees to collect carts, i.e., Target, GFS, Dollar Tree. Check especially around the perimeter of the parking lots or at bus stops.

You are encouraged to support the missionaries throughout the year, with prayer, emails, and donations. Send financial donations through Funding the Mission. Do not send cash or checks directly to the missionary. Always include the name of the missionary and your church's name on the check or online giving. For retired missionaries, send financial donations/cards directly to their home. Any amount over \$600 needs to have a 1099 attached.

Life on the mission field often means dealing with uncertain or inconsistent internet and not enough time in the day to get everything done. We give grace for our missionaries on responding as we know this personal connection is as vital to them as it is for your church.

75th Anniversary of Alabaster

The Church of the Nazarene was experiencing a crunch in mission funding. At the 1949 General NMI Council meeting, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Vennum was asked to come up with an idea that would raise additional money for land purchases and building construction needs

on Nazarene mission fields. During the return trip, on the train, to her home, Vennum said the Lord gave her the details for the Alabaster offering.

The offering promotion was based on the story of the woman pouring perfume on Jesus from a container carved out of soft alabaster stone. Building on that Biblical story, Mrs. Vennum decided to ask Nazarene women to put off buying new perfume for themselves or postpone getting a new dress and to give the money to missions in the same way the woman gave her bottle of perfume to Jesus. Mrs. Vennum promoted her offering idea with the slogan:

"Give up a want to meet a need."

We understand that a church consists of people of God and not a building, though a building conveys an attitude that the Church of the Nazarene intends to "put down roots."

Alabaster is usually received in February and September though the date is up to the local church. No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.

Challenge all ages to regularly contribute and use a box / container as a prayer reminder. Publicize Alabaster offering dates/times in at least a month in advance. Remember to send in your funds soon after receiving the offering(s) so monies can be dispersed to the various needs.

<u>Peacemaker:</u> Pray for the missionaries to be peacemakers and not allow bitterness and anger to invade their thoughts and actions.

"Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice." Ephesians 4:31

<u>Team Prayers:</u> Pray that YOU will be a faithful, consistent "team prayer" for the missionaries and their children.

"The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective." James 5:16b

Missionary Health Care (Memorial Roll and DSA)

The cost of providing insurance for Nazarene missionaries is quite high. In fact, the cost for health insurance alone for a year is approximately \$1.9 million, and the costs are continuing to rise.

Through giving to Memorial Roll, DSA, Gifts from the Heart (cash donation in a person's name) and Missionary Health Care plate offerings, YOU helped offset approximately 23% of those insurance costs. THANK YOU! The remaining 77% is provided by World Evangelism Funds.

When Missionary Health Care giving increases, monies from the WEF are freed up to be used in other places. (Did you know: Missionary Health Care qualifies as 10% giving credit.)

Memorial Roll, established in 1919, is a way to honor deceased friends and loved ones. Church or individuals may place as many names on the Memorial Roll as they desire, and the memorialized need not be members of the church. Cost is \$75 each and ordering online is the preferred method.


The Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is a tribute to church people who are living and for their service to the church. The finances received are used for Missionary Health (insurance etc).

Although the DSA is given through NMI, it need not be given in the area of missions.


A church may wish to honor anyone in the church for their efforts though it may only be given by a church or a group within the church.

A DSA may be awarded to a couple as long as only one tribute message is submitted. The certificate fits in an 8" x 10 " frame.

Cost is \$125 and ordering online is the preferred method.









Live compassionately all year long by being the hands and feet of Jesus – both locally and globally.

2022 Nazarene Fast Facts

- The Church of the Nazarene ministers in 164 world areas.
- In 2021, there were 492 missionaries originating from 63 world areas, serving in 91 countries. Of these missionaries, 336 served as global deployed and 156 were sponsored deployed. Last year, there were 50 new missionary deployments. Within these missionary families, there are 306 missionary kids.
- The number of Nazarene churches grew to **31,049 churches**, an increase of 0.56 percent, with **2.64** million members, an increase of 0.90 percent increase from last year.*
- In 2020, there were 489 districts around the world, with 30,184 credentialed clergy.*
- 51 educational institutions, including graduate seminaries/theological colleges, 13 liberal arts colleges/universities, 30 undergraduate seminaries/theological/Bible colleges, 2 nurses training colleges, 1 teacher training college, and 1063 education centers (extension) had a 2021 combined enrollment of 47,997 students globally.*
- Persons in need were treated at community-based clinics and health care centers all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guinea, and Eswatini (formerly known as Swaziland).*
- **393 retired missionaries** received benefits through the Global Missions Pension Plan for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.
- NMI membership was 1,001,381, with 18,916 organized local NMIs.
- JESUS Film Harvest Partners (JFHP), raising \$3.67 million, reports that World Evangelism Fund (WEF) helped provide infrastructure for 914 JFHP teams to share God's love. In 2020–2021, the teams reported 1.6 million evangelistic contacts. Of these contacts, 480,222 indicated decisions for Christ with 310,633 initial discipleship follow-ups. The teams started 9,717 preaching points in 2021.
- NMI and others partnered with local churches to help raise US \$37. 8 million through the World Evangelism Fund during the 2020-2021 fiscal year.**
- Churches globally gave US \$27.7 million for Approved Mission Specials.**
- In 2021, 95 districts gave 5.5 percent of their income and beyond to the World Evangelism Fund (53 of which were from regions other than the US/Canada region). WEF giving beyond 5.5 percent helps open new work, sustains works opened in recent years, and helps send new missionaries that God calls.¹
- Missionary Health Care provided US \$457,915 in medical assistance for Nazarene missionaries, through offerings, Memorial Roll gifts, and Distinguished Service Award gifts.**
- Nazarenes gave US \$292,638 to World Mission Broadcast (WMB), providing radio, television, and Internet programs to share the gospel globally.**
- Nazarenes gave US \$3.78 million in deputation offerings for missionaries.**
- "NMI has all 6 regions participating in Links, contributing **\$183,821**, and creating personalized connections between local churches, districts, and missionaries around the world. Each connection is vital in continuing to share about the impact of missions.

- Nazarenes gave US \$2.29 million for Alabaster, to fund construction projects in 2021. The Alabaster Offering is used in all six global regions.** No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.
- International Student Scholarship Fund (NMI 80th Anniversary project) provided 79 scholarships for students outside the USA/Canada to attend Nazarene theological institutions.
- NMI partnered with Nazarene Compassionate Ministries to give more than US \$5.7 million, for disaster response and compassion projects around the world and to support 11,236 children through Child Development Centers and Pastor's Kid programs.**
- NMI assisted Work & Witness in raising approximately US \$664,502.

God has blessed the efforts of the Church of the Nazarene during the COVID-19 pandemic, extending grace, bringing hope, and ministering peace to those in need of Him around the world. Thank you for your faithfulness in these uncertain times.

¹ "New work" refers to new world areas, a geographical area, or new entities such as institutions. Pioneer areas or Phase 1 districts are considered new work. When a district reaches Phase 2, it is no longer a "new work."
